# Child Development and School Readiness

## Children Develop in 5 Main Areas

- 1. Cognitive

  Ability to solve problems
- 2. Social and Emotional
  Ability to interact with others
- 3-Speech and Language
  Ability to understand and use language
- 4. Fine Motor Skill

  Ability to use small muscles (hands/fingers)
- 5. Gross Motor Skill
  Ability to use large muscles







Parenting expectations: example- give only verbal help

Books: example- help them learn to sit for the entirety of a book

Outings: example- visit the library, zoo, or store to help children learn appropriate behavior in these environments

Fine Motor Skill Development: example- practice cutting, coloring, drawing, and writing their name

Collaboration: example- work with the child's teacher to identify signs of delays in development so they can be targeted before school starts.
