- We got the letter regarding the Corrective Action Plan. It was approved that we have made the necessary corrections and has been closed.
- We are waiting for the 45-day notice for our Protocol II review. Information for the review was included in the packet. We will continue to discuss this each month until it happens. They will want Policy Council and Board participation. They will ask questions about Policy Council involvement, if information is shared and Policy Council opinion. The interview usually lasts about an hour. As it gets closer, we will see who would like to participate from Policy Council and provide them with information so they feel comfortable to do so.

- We are finishing up the in-kind app. It may not be ready to use until next school year.
 The fiscal department is working on individualizing it to work for Bear River Head Start.
 When it is done, parents will be able to enter their in-kind time on their phone while working with their kids at home, calculate the numbers and it will automatically go to the Fiscal Office to calculate the in-kind.
- Policy Council was asked if they would prefer for us to try to push through all the hires we can up until a scheduled meeting starts or wait and hold an interim meeting later. An unofficial vote was taken. Policy Council prefers to have them pushed through, even at the last minute to avoid having to plan for additional meetings. They feel the background information done in the interview process, including reference checks, means the new hires are thoroughly vetted before they go before Policy Council. The information provided for their review is brief and concise.

For immediate safety concerns, please call 911 or proceed to the nearest Emergency Department.

We focus our therapy services on two general needs in our community: 1) Strengthening family relationships and 2) Healing from trauma. We strive to help families heal, communicate, and increase love and support

in their relationships. In treating trauma, we strive to help individuals and families cope with and recover from the effects of abuse and other crimes. We provide individual counseling, marriage and family therapy, and a wide array of group therapy and workshops. We welcome military and refugee families and are able to provide services in Spanish and English, as well as other languages with the assistance of interpreter services. For qualified victims of crime, we can provide additional advocacy and assistance.

If you or your family are experiencing problems with any of the following, we may be able to help:

Trauma experienced by yourself or a loved one, including crime victimization.

Parent-child or other family relationships with children and teens

Marriage communication or relationship quality

Mental health challenges that affect family relationships (for example, depression and anxiety that impacts your family)

We welcome refugee, military, and immigrant families, as well as others with a variety of needs. We will do what we can to help you with your unique situation. We invite you to explore the services we offer as listed below.

Screening

Free screening consultation with our therapy team. This is a one-time visit that helps us understand your specific situation and needs and connect you to services here and/or in the community. Call <u>435-752-8880</u> to schedule or use our <u>online scheduler</u>.

Note to parents: If you are seeking therapy for your minor-age child, please come to the screening appointment yourself or with your spouse – please do not bring your children to this first appointment.

Kid's Place and Starfish children's center

The Kid's Place is a free, temporary program offered to caregivers with children ages 11 and under. Our goal is to provide a safe, caring place for children to stay when caregivers need extra support. We focus on emotions and the needs of children and caregivers. This service is open to all families in our community.

Scheduled Weekly Care

We provide caregivers and children with a weekly 2 hour break on a temporary basis, generally 6 months of care. Call <u>435-752-8880</u> for availability, there could be a wait list. Examples:

My wife is in the military and it's overwhelming to parent our children alone every day.

I recently became a single-parent and I need help adjusting.

I'm a stay-at-home mom and sometimes I need time for myself.

Crisis Care

Immediate child care is provided for caregivers in the event of an emergency, when other options fall through. Crisis care is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Length of time varies as we work with you. Examples:

I'm having a baby and there is no one to take care of my 3 year old.

I have a therapy appointment and my babysitter just fell through.

I recently moved here and I don't know anyone who can watch my kids and I've reached the end of my rope.
