## 21. Budget Committee/Fiscal Report:

- The 2023-2024 Fiscal Year is 33% complete as of May 31.
- The Change of Scope Narrative was submitted to the Regional Office.
- We are in final preparations for implementing our Online Payroll System, Gusto, with the first pay day being July 12.
- The annual Fiscal Audit has been moved to July 10-12.
- Reports SF425, SF428 and Final Program Progress reports were prepared and submitted.
- The Critical Fiscal Issues Procedure and Random Timecard Audit Procedures were created last year as part of a Corrective Action Plan to address past concerns with time cards. As they are procedures and not policies, they are not required to be brought to Policy Council for review and approval. They are still being used. No changes were made to either procedure. The process for time card audits once Gusto is implemented was discussed.

#### 22. Director's Report:

- We are in process of writing our base grant, Program Improvement Report, Community Assessment, PIR, etc. during the summer to prepare for next service year.
- Policy Council and Board membership were discussed.

#### 23. Board Report:

- Brooks Bodily was approved as the new Board Member with a background and expertise
  in financial management and accounting. Andy Hernandez was the person filling this
  position on Board but is now our Fiscal Officer.
- They approved the Policy Council Bylaws and Composition, the Change of Scope Narrative and an amendment to the lease agreement for Logan Pointe Suite 120, which is one of the suites for the Pond center.
- They received the same reports and updates as Policy Council.
- The Fiscal Office reorganization was discussed. The Fiscal Office staff operate under the license of a Certified Public Accountant. We subcontract with Andy Hernandez of Jones-Simkins.
